



# Tobacco in Mississippi


## **CIGARETTE USE\*1-2**





#### OTHER TOBACCO USE

- The prevalence of smokeless tobacco use among adults in Mississippi was 7.5% in 2014.<sup>3</sup>
- In 2016, 6.0% of adults in Mississippi reported current use of e-cigarettes.<sup>4</sup>
- In 2015, 11.6% of high school students in Mississippi used chewing tobacco, snuff, or dip on at least one day in the past 30 days. Nationally, 7.3% of high school students used smokeless tobacco on at least one day in the past 30 days.<sup>2</sup>
- In 2015, 16.5% of high school students in Mississippi smoked cigars, cigarillos, or little cigars on at least one day in the past 30 days. Nationally, 10.3% of high school students smoked cigars, cigarillos, or little cigars on at least one day in the past 30 days.<sup>2</sup>
- In 2015, 22.9% of high school students in Mississippi used electronic vapor products on at least one day in the past 30 days. Nationally, 24.1% of high school students used electronic vapor products on at least one day in the past 30 days.<sup>2</sup>




#### ECONOMICS OF TOBACCO USE AND TOBACCO CONTROL

- In FY2017, Mississippi allocated \$10.7 million in state funds to tobacco prevention, which is 29.4% of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's (CDC) Annual Spending Target.<sup>5</sup>
- Mississippi received an estimated \$249.9 million in tobacco settlement payments and taxes in FY2017.5
- The health care costs in Mississippi, directly caused by smoking, amount to \$1.23 billion annually.
- Mississippi loses \$1.8 billion in productivity each year due to smoking.<sup>6</sup>

# STATE TOBACCO LAWS<sup>7-9</sup>

#### **EXCISE TAX**

- The state tax increased to \$0.68 per pack of cigarettes in May 2009. Mississippi is ranked 39th in the United States for its cigarette tax. The national average cigarette tax is \$1.71 per pack of cigarettes. The highest state cigarette tax is New York (\$4.35) and the lowest state cigarette tax is Missouri (\$0.17).
- All other tobacco products are taxed 15% of the manufacturer's list price.



#### **CLEAN INDOOR AIR ORDINANCES**

- Smoking is prohibited in public schools and childcare facilities.
- Smoking restrictions are required in government workplaces.
- There are no smoking restrictions for private workplaces, restaurants, bars, casinos/gaming establishments, retail stores, and recreational/cultural facilities.

#### YOUTH ACCESS LAWS

- The minimum age requirement for the purchase of tobacco products is 18, and penalties exist for both minors and merchants who violate this law.
- Establishments are required to post signs stating that sales to minors are prohibited.
- The sale to minors of alternative nicotine products, including electronic cigarettes, is prohibited.

#### CESSATION STATISTICS AND BENEFITS

- The CDC estimates that 60% of adult every day smokers in Mississippi quit smoking for one or more days in 2015.<sup>10</sup>
- The Affordable Care Act requires all Medicaid programs cover all tobacco cessation medications beginning January 1, 2014. 91
- Mississippi's state quitline invests \$2.00 per smoker; the national average investment per smoker is 3.46.
- Mississippi does not have a private insurance mandate provision for cessation.
